MS Snowmobile Tour 2010

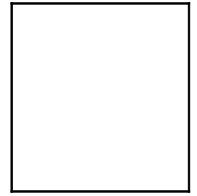
Two CPSC Members Raise over \$4,500.00!



Two members of Chute Pond Snowmobile Club participated January 27-30, 2011 in the 28th Annual MS Snowmobile Tour, a fundraising snowmobile ride to help fight Multiple Sclerosis. Jesse Juedes (above right), of Greenleaf, WI and Dylan Guendert (above left), of Wauwatosa, WI gathered donations and pledges from friends and family, and area businesses totaling over \$4,500.00 to "Help Wipe Out MS". Jesse held a Scavenger Hunt in his home town to raise money for the cause as well. The minimum amount of pledges to enter the event is \$650.00 per person, and we are proud of Jesse and Dylan for going way above that minimum. The ride was presented by the Potawatomi Northern Lights Casino and Hotel in Carter, which was the home base for the riders. Over 100 riders split up into various sized riding groups and enjoyed the fabulous snowmobile trails of northeast Wisconsin on Friday and Saturday. The Tombstone Pickerel Snowmobile Club provided lunch at their clubhouse for the riders on Friday, and Paul Bunyan Riders Snowmobile club sponsored lunch at Waubee Lake Lodge on Saturday.
